#### **PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

#### **Understanding the Hampshire Local Government Reorganisation:**

#### What It Means for Old Basing & Lychpit.

In recent months, you may have heard about the proposed re-organistion of local government across Hampshire. While the finer details are still being finalised, it's important for residents of Old Basing & Lychpit to understand the proposals and what changes might be on the horizon.

#### What Is Local Government Reorganisation?

Hampshire currently operates under a two-tier system of local government outside of Portsmouth and Southampton: Hampshire County Council handles services like education, social care, highways, and libraries; District and Borough Councils, such as Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council, are responsible for planning, waste collection, housing, and environmental health. The proposed Local Government Reorganisation seeks to replace this two-tier model with a unitary authority system. In such a system, a single council would be responsible for all local government services in an area.

#### What Are the Proposals?

There are several models being discussed, but the most likely scenarios include: A Single Unitary Authority covering the whole of Hampshire (excluding Portsmouth and Southampton); Two or More Smaller Unitaries, such as splitting the county into north and south regions, or grouping boroughs together (e.g. a North Hampshire unitary authority including Basingstoke & Deane); Maintaining the status quo (although this is seen as increasingly unsustainable by many local leaders). These proposals are being driven by the need for financial efficiency, service improvement, and clearer lines of accountability.

#### What Does This Mean for Our Parish?

For Old Basing & Lychpit, the biggest change would be who delivers and manages local services. Instead of dealing with both the County Council and Borough Council, residents would have a single point of contact for services like: Roads and highways maintenance; Waste collection and recycling; Education and social care; Planning and development control. The Parish Council would continue to operate as the grassroots tier of local government, with its current responsibilities such as open spaces, playgrounds, and local events.

#### **Potential Benefits**

Simplified services: One council, one contact number, one website. Cost savings: Less duplication of back-office functions. Stronger local voice: A unitary authority might allow for more streamlined decision-making and greater focus on local needs.

#### **Potential Concerns**

Reduced local knowledge: Larger unitary authorities may struggle to stay in tune with the unique needs of smaller communities; Fewer local councillors: With fewer councils overall, residents may have less direct access to their elected representatives; Transition disruption: Reorganisation takes time and could lead to short-term confusion or service delays.

#### **What Happens Next?**

The reorganisation process is being led by Hampshire County Council, in consultation with local districts and other stakeholders. Proposals may be submitted to the government for consideration over the coming year, and there could be public consultations as part of that process. At this stage, no final decisions have been made, and any changes are unlikely to take effect before 2027 at the earliest.

#### **Have Your Say**

Residents will have an opportunity to express their views once formal consultation begins. In the meantime, your Parish Council will continue to monitor developments closely and keep the community informed. If you have any questions or wish to share your thoughts on this topic, please don't hesitate to contact the Parish Office.





#### **CHURCHYARD CONSERVATION GROUP (PIOCC)**



This month's working parties will be on Saturday, 2nd August at 10.00am and Thursday 28th August at 2.00pm – meet by the PIOCC noticeboard at the entrance to the Conservation Area. We will continue the summer season maintenance to encourage the wild flowers and associated wildlife. This community project is not just for those who attend services at St Mary's, we welcome all who

would like to help. The tools are provided. Just turn up in gardening clothes and bring gloves. Our Saturday morning sessions last about three hours (with a coffee break and

chance to relax) and our Thursday afternoons about two hours. Our volunteers make a real difference.

Soon the swifts will start their long journey back to Africa, but there is still plenty to see especially on a sunny summer's day when the butterflies will be flying amongst the grasses and flowers of the Central Glade. Look for Meadow Browns (photograph right – Margaret Carr), they love the tall uncut grass, whilst Speckled Woods prefer the shady woodland and Gatekeepers favour the purple Marjoram flowers. The Buddleia flowers are popular with Red Admirals. Perhaps you will see Small Tortoiseshells, Peacocks or Painted Lady butterflies nectaring there too. Marbled Whites, the second brood of Brimstones and Common Blues may also appear. Why not come and see what you can find?

#### LINGUATASTIC LANGUAGE SCHOOL



June seems quite a way away now, but we still wanted to provide an update on what happened at the Old Basing and Lychpit Carnival....

One of the reasons for choosing this cartoon is that it has been translated into over 60 different languages. In lots of languages, the character's name is either the same or stays close to the original meaning. However, in some languages, it is slightly different. For example, in German, he is known as "SpongeBob Schwammkopf", the latter meaning "sponge head" and in Vietnamese "Chú bọt biển tinh nghịch", means "mischievous sponge"!

The job of translating cartoons, films, books, indeed anything, is an extremely challenging one. Not only does it require excellent knowledge of the two languages, but an in-depth understanding of the cultures of the countries where they are spoken is also essential.

Cartoons not only get translated from one language into another, but their content may also end up being modified to align with the target culture's sensibilities. It must though, be challenging to strike the right balance of adapting content to the target culture and preserving elements of the source culture (and thus giving different cultures exposure to one another).

#### **NATURE NOTES FOR AUGUST**

As is often the case this time of year, interesting pictures or stories of note in the natural world are quite few and far between, especially when the heat we have had does certainly affect wildlife the same as it does us, as in, we don't want to do much. Butterflies are however perhaps the exception with hatches really thriving when it comes to hot weather, so I have had a couple of photos from various sites around the area. Thanks to those of you who have contributed – these photos are found in Basinga Extra.

On a walk alongside the railway near the footbridge, Lychpit based 'David' noted a lovely Ringlet butterfly and a Burnet moth (right), which I believe to be a five-spot, although it does look a little different with its wings open from the picture taken last month by Jim Andrews which is definitely one of these. This one was in the Millfield which is surely 'the place' to go if you want to go looking for many of the UK's wonderful variety of lepidoptera.

Regular correspondent Stephen Thair also meandered the railway line footpath to Ashmoor Lane and saw a number of Silver-washed Fritillaries, an insect that generally emerges now, in the height of summer.



However, footpaths and hedgerows where wildflowers thrive alongside numerous shrubs will attract many species and Phil Males snapped a Small Copper and a quite rare butterfly on his stroll in Binfields Woodland park, that being a White Admiral. Unfortunately, it was enjoying a feast on the ground with a bright background, so the image is sadly not clear enough to reproduce but I 'borrowed' one (*right*) from the internet to show.



With memories of this years Wimbledon tennis fortnight now fading, have you ever wondered where all the old balls go to? Even if you're not a tennis fan you would have surely heard the phrase 'new balls please' uttered countless time during the tournament. Staggeringly, some 55,000 balls are got through during the 14 days and many of course find their way into local tennis clubs and fans pockets afterwards. However, another

innovative use was put into place recently with the Wildlife Trusts in Avon, Glamorgan and Northumberland receiving them to protect harvest mice! Yes, you read that correctly.

These tiny creatures build their own circular nests in the wild from grasses but are vulnerable to any predator that might find their exquisite little home but a tennis ball, with a suitably sized hole cut in the side, makes a perfect safe and cosy environment in which the mouse can live and breed as the photograph (*right*) shows.

How great is that?

After a very dry summer in Old Basing so far, your garden in August will likely need some recovery, resilience planning and TLC, and hope that unseasonal rain will fall for at least part of the month. Here are key tips to help you manage and revive your garden:

**General Garden Care:** Water deeply but less often. Focus on early morning or late evening watering to reduce evaporation. Deep watering encourages roots to grow downward, making plants more drought-resistant.

**Mulch, mulch:** Add organic mulch (compost, bark, grass clippings) around plants to conserve moisture, suppress weeds, and regulate soil temperature.

**Weed control:** Remove weeds regularly – they compete with your plants for water and nutrients, especially in dry conditions.

**Flowers and Perennials:** Deadhead regularly. Remove spent flowers to encourage continued blooming and prevent plants from putting energy into seed production. Cut back stressed perennials. Trim damaged foliage to encourage fresh growth. Water and feed them with a diluted liquid fertilizer. Plan ahead: Consider drought-tolerant plants (like lavender, echinacea, or sedum) if your garden struggled this summer.

**Vegetables:** Harvest frequently. Pick crops like beans, courgettes, and tomatoes regularly to encourage further production. Shade delicate crops. Use fleece or garden netting to protect against intense sun if it continues into August. Sow autumn crops. It's a great time to sow lettuce, spinach, radishes and spring cabbages.

**Trees, Shrubs, and Lawns:** Water young trees and shrubs. Prioritise any planted in the last two years. A slow, deep soak every 7–10 days is more effective than frequent light watering. Don't feed stressed lawns, wait until cooler weather returns. You can lightly scarify and reseed bare patches in late August or early September. Top up mulch around shrubs. This helps keep roots cool and moist after the dry spell.

**Wildlife and Sustainability:** Keep water out for wildlife: Shallow dishes or bird baths are vital during drought. Refresh them daily. Leave some seed heads: While dead-heading most flowers is good, leave a few for birds to feed on and for winter interest.
