PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

COUNCILLOR CO-OPTION

At the June Parish Council meeting we were pleased to welcome a new Councillor, **Francesca Maritan**, who resides in Old Basing and has a wide range of skills to offer the Parish Council. We do, however, now have another Councillor vacancy following the resignation of John Robinson who unfortunately resigned at the June Parish Council meeting. John has taken a keen interest in a wide variety of parish matters and has been an invaluable member of the council. We will be sorry to see John go and wish him well in his future pursuits.

PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT OF HODD'S FARM SITE OLD007

It has recently been announced that the imminent threat of development of **Hodds Farm** is highly likely to be excluded from the next **Local Plan** update. The Parish Council will continue to work with other local groups to try and protect possible development sites **OLD001** ("East of Basingstoke") and **OLD002** (Lodge Farm), which is undoubtedly going to be quite a challenge.

WAR MEMORIAL

Anyone who has visited St Mary's Church recently will have noticed how resplendent the war memorial is looking. Local resident, **Kevin Day**, is a volunteer for the Commonwealth War Graves Commission, and approached the Parish Council to offer his skills to brighten up the monument on its behalf. We are extremely grateful to Kevin for the time he's taken to bring such an improvement to this very special tribute and would like to thank him for his generous gesture.

CLIMATE CHANGE MEETING

Many of you attended the **Parish Council's public meeting** in November, when we discussed a range of energy related issues such as insulation, heat pumps, waste and recycling and the need to plant more trees. The follow up meeting scheduled for December had to be cancelled, but the **next meeting** will now take place on **Wednesday, 20th July**, at **7.30pm** in **Lychpit Community Hall**, when we hope that residents will form groups that will meet regularly and develop expertise, produce information, and promote action towards reducing energy use in the Parish.

1 NEWS ABOUT BATS

Thank you to David Byatt for information about bats. Apparently we have lots! Soprano and Common Pipistrelles, Long Brown eared, Nactuals, Natterer's, Daubentons (which are particularly associated with water) and Barbestelles (who are present in Crabtree and the Old Basing area) and Bechsteins. The last two species are woodland bats. The rarest record from a few years ago was a grey long-eared bat which had to be nursed back to heath and when released by the old watercress beds went down the Loddon for a couple of kilometres before rousting in Old Basing. Then its tracker failed.

2 RUBBISH!

Today, 27th May, there's a new little clutch of ducklings out on the Loddon by Bartons Mill. Let's hope they survive the heron and other predators. Sometimes you find less pleasant things in the river. The remains of an old wheelbarrow had to be fished out the other day. It was very difficult to see with the reflection on the water but any child or dog that jumped in on top of it would have been hurt. As a chalk stream the Loddon should be clear and pristine and we want to keep it that way and improve it to promote wildlife recovery.

3 INVESTIGATE OUR RIVER!

We have made up a Loddon trail with activities for families to do on the way. For details of activities, instructions and a map to follow go to the SOLVE website. It might take more than one outing so possibly something to do in those long summer holidays. You may learn something and we hope you have some fun.

LOCAL PLAN UPDATE: "IT AIN'T OVER UNTIL THE FAT LADY SINGS!"

The Economic, Planning and Housing Committee papers continue to shortlist Pyotts Hill for 900 houses and Lodge Farm for a slightly reduced number of 600 dwellings. There are problems with odour – no surprise there – being located right next to a sewage treatment plant and incinerator! Please continue to log any bad smells when/running walking etc in the Loddon valley. It is important that we have an accurate picture of this problem as experienced by residents and not "what the algorithm says".

Hodds Farm is not currently shortlisted but the text relating to it is bizarre. If you are a natural optimist enjoy the moment; if a strategist then "It ain't over until the fat lady sings!". This means any site can come back in and there is a very real danger of that. We are pushing hard for the entire river catchment to be a Local Nature Recovery Strategy site; this would be entirely in keeping with the Biodiversity Opportunity Area designation this valley has had for a very long time.



Please do comment on the **East Basingstoke Natural Environment Plan** which covers the Lime Pits, Crabtree, Basing Common, the Mill Field and town centre sites. It's important to support and shape these initiatives and to ensure we have natural space and countryside in which residents and nature can thrive. Comments in by **Friday, 8th July**, so skates on! ODIHAM AND OLD BASING HEALTH CENTRES

It's been a busy quarter as you can see from our April practice figures below.

We're delighted to welcome **Dr Holly Poppe**, **Dr Toyin Bode-Abass**, **Dr Sarah Sierens**, **Paramedic Jason Rausch** and Physicians Associate **Sitara Khan** to the clinician team and we're pleased to confirm we've increased our reception team.

Please continue to wear a facemask in our health centres unless you are exempt, we have had a high staff sickness rate and need to be well to help you.

WHAT IS LYME DISEASE?

Lyme disease is a bacterial infection that can be spread to humans by infected ticks. It's usually easier to treat if it's diagnosed early. Not all ticks in England carry the bacteria that causes Lyme Disease. But it's still important to be aware of ticks and to safely remove them as soon as possible, just in case.

To remove a tick safely: Use fine-tipped tweezers or a tick-removal tool (you can buy these from some pharmacies, vets and pet shops), grasp the tick as close to the skin as possible, slowly pull upwards, taking care not to squeeze or crush the tick, dispose of it when you have removed it, and clean the bite with antiseptic or soap and water.

The chance of getting ill is low. You do not need to do anything else unless you notice a circular or oval shape rash around a tick bite or become unwell. The rash can appear up to three months after being bitten by an infected tick, but usually appears within one to four weeks. It can last for several weeks. Information taken from www.nhs.uk

CHINEMAM MEDICAL PRACTICE PATIENT PARTICIPATION GROUP

We have an exciting update about our practice building! Approval of a new site. We are delighted that Hampshire, Southampton and Isle of Wight Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) has recently approved plans to relocate the **Chineham Medical Practice** to **Jameson House**, Lutyens Close, and it is hoped the move into the new premises will take place the end of 2023. You may have already visited the site as it has been the vaccination centre for North Hampshire and is close to the Chineham shopping centre. Once developed the new premises will provide: more space – where you can have the care you need; better access – especially for people with disabilities; improved privacy – through better room design; and wellbeing focus – a garden designed with an emphasis on mental wellbeing. Jameson House will have modern treatment room space for other additional services (including baby clinics, ultrasound, physiotherapy, joint injections and the ability to carry out minor procedures) reducing the need for people to be seen in hospital.

The increased space will make it easier for health and social care professionals (such as GPs, nurses, midwives, physiotherapists, counsellors, district nurses, social prescribers etc) to work more closely together in the same building. 

During the day the stream is a popular spot for Swallows and House Martins swooping in on flying insects whilst visitors later in the evening will see an increase in the number of bats on the wing. Our butterflies and moths are emerging on sunny days so look out for daytime moths such as the Silver Y and the Burnet, distinctive for its red spots on black wings. Those looking for plants in July will find the Bee and Common Spot orchids, as well as the flowering of the towering Woolly Thistle. Check out our Facebook page for photos.

JULY IN YOUR GARDEN

This is often one of the hottest months of the year so being water wise is the order of the month. Using water butts, trying to only water pots and new plants if dry and keeping bird baths and ponds clean and topped up should all be priorities. To make water go further, water thoroughly less frequently, rather than little and often, a few times a week rather than every day, depending on rainfall. If your ground has become dry, spike it gently with a garden fork before watering to aid the penetration of the water. If you have hanging baskets place buckets under them to catch excess water that can be used in other areas of the garden.

Unless in drought, lawns should be mown regularly. Setting the blades slightly higher can protect the grass in very hot weather, but any brown patches will soon recover once autumn rains return. Try to only use a sprinkler if absolutely necessary. Ants and weeds will probably be your biggest problems right now, so brush off the former and spot treat or dig out the latter. The growing rate of the grass will slow towards the end of summer so setting a higher blade height then will make the grass more resistant to wear. Summer baskets can be kept looking at their best if they are cut back and then fed. This can encourage new growth and revive their display. Deadhead flower borders and cut back hardy geraniums and delphiniums after the first flush of flowers to encourage more blooms.

You can propagate your own flowers by starting to collect seed heads and by taking cuttings of container and patio plants. Feeding and mulching borders will really help encourage a good display as well as retaining moisture, reducing the need to water and will also suppress weeds. It is probably the best thing you can do for your garden right now. The best mulches are 2 to 3 ins (5 to 7 cm) thick and are rich in organic matter.

Evergreen hedges such as Lonicera nitada, Box and Privet can be clipped this month and the clippings added to the compost heap if they aren't too woody. Once Clematis Montana has finished flowering, it can be cut back – hard if necessary. Honeysuckle and climbing roses will need tying in to their supports, the latter need to be tied as horizontal as possible to ensure the best showing of flowers.

If you need to propagate any shrubs, now is the time to take softwood cuttings of plants such as lavender, rosemary, hydrangea and philadelphus. While you are doing this now is the best time to cut lavender for drying, choosing newly opened flowers for the best fragrance, then hang up in a cool, dark place.

June-flowering shrubs such as philadelphus can be pruned now and while you are at it, take some semi-ripe cuttings to create new plants. Hydrangea and Choisya can also be propagated from cuttings that are placed in pots of gritty compost and placed into a cold frame. Remove suckers from rose bushes and trees and tie in climbers and ramblers as they grow.

House plants can benefit by being placed outside for the warmer months and plants in the greenhouse will need shading to protect them from scorching under glass. Keep an eye out for red spider mite, white fly, mealy bugs and scale insects and treat appropriately.

Finally keep on top of fallen leaves and flowers to help prevent some pest and disease problems. Above all, be sure to take some time off from weeding and watering to relax and enjoy the rewards of your labour.

NATURE NOTES FOR JULY

On the evidence of residents that have nesting boxes, it would seem that it's been a pretty good breeding season for Blue Tits at least. These are the most prevalent of the Tit family to use urban nesting sites so all reports this year concern them. I have noticed a few Great and Long Tailed Tit families moving from tree to bush, hunting out any bug that will do but your messages suggest that broods, in camera boxes at least, have done well. Terry McAnish was like an expectant father waiting for the chicks in his box to fledge and then when they did, he was outside ensuring the ever-present Sparrowhawk wasn't around to pick up one of the four (out of eight eggs) that emerged.

Old friend Graham Cadell in Apple Way also enjoys the ups, and it must be said, the downs, of having a camera box because not always is there a happy ending. This year, most of the eight eggs laid did hatch and five chicks fledged so a reasonable result. Graham was astonished at the strength and tenacity of the parent as he watched it drag a dead chick out of the box, a completely necessary task which might have spelt the demise of the rest of the family had it remained there.



I'm guilty (again!) of not walking the river and surrounding area much this spring so have missed hearing the Whitethroats and other incoming songsters around the Mill Field. Nevertheless, I was delighted to hear from **Jim Andrews** that a pair of Cetti's Warblers successfully raised a couple of chicks in the reed beds opposite to Tithe Barn, which Jim believes is a first for Old Basing area. I asked if he'd managed to get a shot of the youngsters or adults, but they flit around in the undergrowth too much for that, but his photography skills did pick out this lovely picture (see left) of a **Roebuck** relaxing in the long grass of Mill Field

I don't know if you caught the episode of 'Springwatch' this week that showed the macabre demise of a Skylarks nest?

Presenter Chris Packham admitted what happened was a first for him, in the shape of a hedgehog finding the ground located nest with two young in and then proceeded to eat them! It was ghastly to watch but hedgehogs are mostly meat eaters and aren't fussy what that means as long as it's a meal. Nature is cruel but with hog numbers down these days by 70% from 25 years ago, what would we prefer?

On the flip side to a reduction of one of our wild creatures, the comeback of the Red Kite has been astonishing, and we are all used to the sight and sound of these magnificent birds in the air above us. There has clearly been a successful rearing of some young going on as I watched three birds above my garden this week, drifting around on the breeze and calling as they do, but one was a bit wobbly and had a weird higher pitched contact call. I then noticed the bird had under-developed tail feathers, so it was almost certainly a bird perhaps on a maiden flight.
