Not only did Shakespeare's words stick, but they also branded the phrase—and the date, March 15—with a dark and gloomy connotation. It's likely that many people who use the phrase today don't know its true origin. The Ides of March actually has a non-threatening history. Kalends, Nones and Ides were ancient markers used to reference dates in relation to lunar phases. Ides simply referred to the first full moon of a given month, which usually fell between the 13th and 15th. In fact, the Ides of March once signified the new year, which meant celebrations and rejoicing.

CONGRATULATIONS

Firstly, to the **Basinga** on achieving Overall Fourth Place and **Best Edited Magazine** in the **National Parish Magazine Awards**. When you consider how many parish magazines are published, this is a great achievement.

We must also offer huge congratulations to local resident, **Katherine Antrobus** and her two Vodafone colleagues in breaking the world record as the fastest group of three women to row from La Gomera in the Canaries to Antigua in a race known as "The World's Toughest Row" – what an incredible achievement! Katherine and her colleagues raised money for WWF and UNHCF with donations being match-funded by the Vodafone Foundation.

THIEVES VISIT THE RECREATION GROUND - AGAIN!

Yet again the workshop at the recreation ground has been broken into and this time, unable to breach the security on the doors, the thieves smashed a hole through the wall at the rear of the building! Despite the alarm sounding and other security measures activating, thousands of pounds worth of grounds maintenance equipment was stolen.

Police and our security company were on site in less than eight minutes of the alarm activating but those responsible had disappeared. For some reason the automatic gate installed at the entrance to the grounds just before Christmas was open on that particular night. CCTV images have been passed to the police to enable them to build up a profile of this and similar incidents elsewhere in the Basingstoke area.

ALLOTMENTS

During the winter our grounds contractors, Larkstel, carried out a huge amount of clearance work at the allotments and along the boundary with the cemetery. This work included removal of very old trees following storm damage and clearance of larger plots that had been vacated. As a result, we have been able to clear our wait-list and now have plots available if anyone is considering taking on an allotment. The plots have all been strimmed ready for someone to take over and Spring is the ideal time of year to start planting. On **10th March**, it is **Mother's Day** here in the UK. Did you know though, that different countries celebrate this on different days? For example, in Luxembourg, it's celebrated in June and in

Argentina it's in October! But even within one country it can vary! For example, in most of Belgium, it is on the second Sunday of May, but in Antwerp, it's on 15th August, the Day of the Assumption of Mary.

Interestingly, Mother's Day as we know it, originated in the USA. After losing her mother in 1905, a woman named Anna Jarvis, campaigned for a day to celebrate mothers. Anna's mother had spent her life helping mothers to care for their children and she wanted mothers' work to be recognised. She is recorded as having said "I hope ... that someone, sometime, will found a memorial mothers' day commemorating her for the matchless service she renders to humanity in every field of life."

A few years later, Mother's Day was introduced and by 1911, it was a holiday across every state in the USA. However, whereas Mrs Jarvis had wanted to celebrate the work done by mothers, Anna's perspective was that of a devoted daughter. Her motto for Mother's Day was "For the Best Mother who Ever Lived—Your Mother." And this is why, in her opinion, the apostrophe had to be before the "s" not after it!

The day continued to grow in popularity and companies saw an opportunity to make money and started selling special cards, flowers and more. Anna became disheartened by the commercialisation of the day and after having campaigned for the introduction of this day, she spent the rest of her life campaigning for people not to buy flowers, etc. at an inflated price and even for the day to be rescinded!

We all sit and watch television without a thought as to what is entailed in putting each programme together. And in the days when there was only the two broadcasters of the BBC and ITV the technology was nothing like today, which brought its own difficulties.



Jenny Mallin was the speaker at the latest **Probus** Club meeting at the Test Valley Golf Club and gave an insight into how TV production life was in the seventies. This was through her experiences gained over seven years working at the BBC Television Centre in Shepherd's Bush, West London.

How news programmes were put together with breaking news events that demanded being featured with split

seconds decisions on what to drop from the programme. News film taking up to an hour to process even after arriving at the BBC and then the introduction of ENG, electronic news gathering, with the use of camcorder type film taken by outside reporters.

Jenny recalled her time on the Generation Game working with the legendary Bruce Forsyth and his female assistant Anthea Redfern as a Contestant Researcher and Games Deviser to three years on Mastermind with Magnus Magnusson and a myriad of disc jockeys on Top of the Pops and whether songs were sung live or mimed.

THE MILL FIELD CONSERVATION GROUP



Finally spring is in the air, what a lovely thought......Why not blow the cobwebs away by volunteering at the last official session of the winter 2023/2024 season.

The next work party is planned for Saturday, 16th March. We will be repairing the fence around the stream area and cutting back

small scrubby trees to prevent them getting too big. The fence was created as part of a DEFRA project, and has been flattened, our intention is to prevent people and dogs from entering the protected area. We meet at the far end of the site (Pyotts Hill end) on the edge of the lower meadow near the stream. (Precise **what3words** address is **rear.wasp.script**)

No experience is necessary just wear appropriate clothes and footwear, please meet us at the lower path. We will provide the necessary tools and some refreshments

What's around this month:

We should start hearing the resident birds such as Song Thrush, Robin and Wren in full song. While we say farewell to the Redwings, Fieldfare, Siskins and Lesser Redpolls who are heading back north, the first of the summer migrants begin to arrive starting with Chiffchaff and Blackcap (the very first ones you hear braved the winter).

The plant life suddenly starts to burst to life with Lesser Celandine and Arum Lillies (Lords and ladies) coming through with many trees starting to flower. Mammal wise Roe and Muntjac will be heard barking in the woods and when warm enough bats start to emerge. If we get any spring-like weather butterflies should start appearing such as the Red Admiral, Peacock and Small Tortoiseshell or Brimstone and maybe the occasional reptile too!

MARCH IN YOUR GARDEN

The snowdrops are out, daffodils poking their heads up and crocuses making a gorgeous display all over the village. Let's hope that winter is finally behind us, spring is with us and this growing season will have some normality to it!

There is a lot of sowing that can be done. Some flowers can be started off in the greenhouse, but hardy annuals such as poppies, certain varieties of sweet peas and cornflowers can be sown directly into the ground. Plant tender summer-flowering bulbs such gladioli and lily now, they can provide dramatic, tall blooms, that are scented, to adorn your summer borders. Also, snowdrops can be planted now for next year. Apple and cherry trees can also be planted, but be sure to be ready with the horticultural fleece in case of frosts! They will damage the young leaves. Silver and grey leaf shrubs are the most at risk of frosts at this time of year.

Now is a good time to divide over-grown clumps of summer-flowering perennials but make sure they are kept well watered afterwards – division is most successful when the plants are not in active growth. Ornamental grasses should have dead foliage cut back to allow for new growth. If the weather stays nice and dry, lawns may need a mow, mine is looking rather unsightly at the moment so fingers crossed we get some sun! You should aim to mow it once a week. Roses will do well being fed with a balanced fertiliser or special rose feed. This is also the last opportunity to prune your roses.

Greenhouses can suffer from condensation in springtime, open any vents on warmer days. Whilst you are out, and preferably before the month gets going, search round your pots, bricks and all those nooks and crannies for hibernating snails and slugs and dispose of them before they run amok.

Onion sets can be planted this month. Growing onions from sets is generally easier, they are less likely to be affected by disease, and the crop will mature earlier. However, they are more prone to bolting (when a flower is produced instead of a bulb) – to reduce this risk, plant the heat-treated sets offered for cultivars prone to bolting. Also, make sure you sow under some netting to prevent inquisitive birds from undoing all your hard work.

If you didn't have any luck with broad beans sown in November, not to worry, more can be sown now direct into the ground for harvests throughout the summer, however they will do battle with blackfly, more so then the November-sown crop.

Pond life will start to stir, fish become more active and may be thinking of breeding. As a result, water quality may deteriorate, so get those pumps and filters back on if they have been turned off over winter. Start feeding fish moderately when the water temperature reaches a happy 7°C (45°F) for a week, and more regularly when the temperature is over 10°C (50°F).

Mow established lawns when the weather is mild enough and the grass shows signs of growth. Ensure the first cut of the season is light, raising the blades 0.5cm (¼in) higher than the usual cutting height.

Have you thought about growing asparagus? Rumour has it that it is one of the vegetables that have superior flavour when grown at home compared to when bought at the supermarket or market. They are easy to grow, as long as the conditions are correct. They like light, well-draining soil, free of weeds and big stones. If you have such a space then by all means start buying crowns. They need to be planted this month. If not then why not bear it in mind for next year? A note of caution, it does go quickly!

NATURE NOTES FOR MARCH

Spring is here!! Well, almost. The famous Belle Vue daffodils appeared in mid-January but after many years of claiming them as the first ones 'out,' it seems as if many new varieties of daffs are early bloomers and a number of you have some showing, Ann Price being one.

Travelling near Esher last week (early Feb) there was a whole roundabout with the central grass area completely covered in yellow. Had I not been driving I would have taken a picture as it looked gorgeous. Additionally, the churchyard is now awash with snowdrops and with longer, brighter days now here, you just feel a little more like smiling.

Regular newshound Stephen Thair just reported frogs spawn in his pond, noted on 5th February, a full two weeks earlier than in 2023 so the mild weather has clearly got the plants juices flowing.

There was 'exciting news' from my good friend Jim Andrews that a Waxwing or two had been seen around the Bramley area and then thirty turned up in Aldermaston churchyard. So, while it's not been cold enough to produce an eruption, there is at least a chance you could spot them locally.

Another lovely winter visitor that used to be quite common in gardens is the Siskin, but I had to travel to Blashford Lakes Reserve near Ringwood a week or so back to see them. And there were hundreds, all chattering away at the top of the alders or hungrily feeding on the woodland hide feeders, along with Goldfinches and Tits aplenty. I had not been there before, but I'll certainly go again as it presents a great cross-section of birding opportunities with hides near woodland, streams, lakes, reed beds and grass flats. I think April and May must be a suitable time to revisit as, although a lot of the overwintering ducks will have gone, in will be all the summer visitors so itll be warbler heaven.

I did note also that wardens there have erected an Osprey platform high up in a tree by the side of one of the lakes. I know these majestic birds have stopped off to rest and feed whilst on migration back to the north of the country, but I'm sure there could be a time when they just might decide to stay and breed. Now THAT would be a coup.

Good news, as an outcome, comes from Mike Freer who emailed me and said, 'I thought you might like this picture of two poor little goldfinches that stunned themselves flying into my patio windows. I kept them warm in my hands until they recovered and I'm glad to say they both flew away after 10-15 minutes. Bless'em'

Well Mike, good stuff and you did exactly the right thing as its often the case that a bird will be shocked rather than badly hurt and during that period of recovery, they are vulnerable to cold and predation.

If you did the RSPB Garden Birdwatch, I hope you had a good count and hopefully some species that you might not see every day. I think we had 13 species with the most prolific bird being actually, the Goldfinch! In the past month they have ousted the Blue Tits on the group of sunflower heart feeders and at their peak during the count, we had seven present at one point. Colourful and noisy!
